She created the "Ambassadors of Tolerance Tour" which took the Freedom Writers to visit Auschwitz concentration camp in Poland, Anne Frank's attic in Amsterdam, and war-torn Sarajevo. Their unique journey was chronicled by Academy Award-nominated filmmakers and will be a feature-length documentary.
